

"ALMOND BLOSSOM-RED" – Vincent Van Gogh



"WATERLOO BRIDGE" - Claude Monet



SOLUTION DESCRIPTIONS

- Mop up excess soonest as possible with sponge or cloth.
- Remove surplus with blade edge or appropriate tools.
- Sponge with carpet shampoo from outer side in circular motion inwards to center to avoid stain spread. Dampened with clean water and allow to dry. Following with gentle brushing.
- Blot with sponge with household cleaning agent.
- Sponge with methylated spirits and blot dry.
- Lubricate stain with glycerine or petroleum gel.
- Apply nail polish remover where exclude lanolin or greasy liquid substance.
- Sponge with turpentine.
- Freeze with extractive carpet.
- Clean with regular extractive carpet cleaner.
- Use circular cutter to remove defective portion and replace.
